- CKLA/Amplify Reading Curriculum

- Sadlier Grammar Workshop
- M Grammar (assigned M, due F);
 T/W CKLA Reading Skills; Th/F Writing
- Homework is mostly long-term projects or assignments not finished in class
- Kahoot & Blooket reviews

Academics: ELA

- Monthly Book Reports based on a specific genre; must be at 4th grade level or above and a chapter book (shorter books should have higher reading level)
- One Accelerated Reader test per month at the 4th grade level or above; passing is 80%
- Cougar Club 200 pages each month at any level, genre, or category (fiction, graphic novel, picture book, etc)

Academics: Math

- Go Math!
- Areas of Study: Place Value,
 Addition & Subtraction,
 Multiplication & Division, Perimeter
 & Area, Fractions, Number Patterns
- IXL & Prodigy (special occasions)
- Waggle! new online program with Go Math! Aligns with MAP score
- Mastertrack- provides student data based upon given daily targeted Math Checkpoints

Academics: Math

- Math Homework:
 - Given daily with the exception of assessment days or Fridays
 - Always due the next day
 - Problems will be selected and circled on page as "Must Do's". Students may always complete additional!

Academics: Science

- Nancy Larson
- Areas of Study: Characteristics of Cells, Classification of Plants, Characteristics of Animals, Examining Ecosystems
- Lessons and assignments completed in class
- Egg Drop in June!

Academics: Washington State History

- Washington Our Home
- Regions & Landforms; Native Americans; Explorers & Trade; Early Settlers; Government
- Lessons and assignments mostly completed in class
- Field Trip with Father Michael in Spring: walk around Chambers Bay and Mass at Immaculate Conception in Steilacoom - the first Catholic church in Washington!

Academics: Religion

- Monthly Prayer testing 2 new prayers:
 Prayer for Peace & Memorare
- Monthly focus on a given Virtue & Saint
- Religion curriculum focus: Covenant
- Of the five chapters in each unit- four focus on the four pillars of the Catechism (Believe, Celebrate, Live, Pray)
- The Bible is the core text of the curriculum

Testing

- MAP testing administered three times a year: Fall, Winter, & Spring
- Grade Level Prayers are listed in Google Classroom - Fourth Grade and Religion
- Accelerated Reader tests: one passed every month at 80%; books must be fourth grade level or above; can be chapter books or picture books

Conferences

- Student-led conferences in fourth grade! The student, parents, & teacher will meet together for a 15 minute conference.
- No School for students on October 23 & 24 for conferences.
 A Sign Up Genius will be sent out to choose your conference time.

Communication

- Newsletters go home weekly and are posted to Fourth Grade Google Classroom
- Email is best! We do our best to respond within 24 hours, or by the end of Monday if emailed over the weekend
- Student-led conferences in October
- After school conferences as needed - dependent on schedules
- Spring conferences as needed

Your Fourth Grader

- Changing hormones mean BIG, BIG feelings that happen fast.
